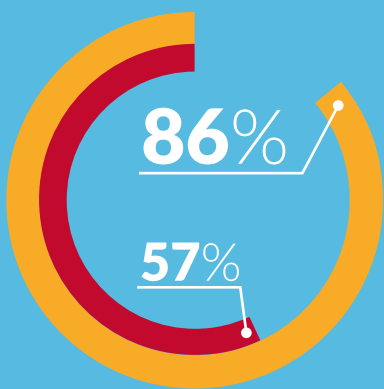


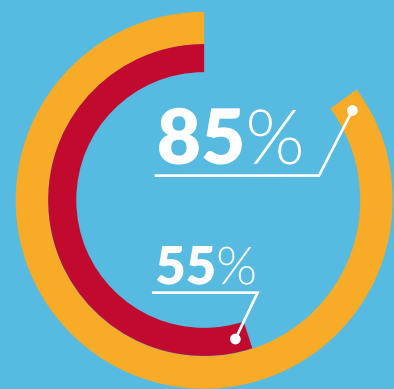
APRIL IS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS & PREVENTION MONTH (SAAPM)



Creating a campus climate that gives students the confidence that their institution will support them and take appropriate action should they ever need to report an act of sexual violence is essential to helping all students feel secure. Offering campus training programs related to sexual assault can equip students with the right information and resources to confidently speak out to not only help themselves but help prevent another act of assault from taking place.



86% of students who received training indicated understanding their institution's formal procedures to address complaints of sexual assault compared to 57% of those without training



85% of students that received training indicated knowing where to get help in the event of a sexual assault compared to 55% of those without training

OVERALL, STUDENTS WITH SOME FORM OF TRAINING IN SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS, PREVENTION, AND REPORTING INDICATED MORE CONFIDENCE IN THEIR INSTITUTIONS' ABILITY AND WILLINGNESS TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEM.
